Next steps for St Paul's

The last few weeks have been some of the most challenging times the education sector has faced. With recent announcements from the government, our school and the Trust have been busy looking at how we can implement the necessary safety measures to ensure the health and safety of an increasing number of staff and pupils in school, from the proposed date of 1st June.

There are many factors involved and, as such, we are completing robust risk assessments in order to evaluate the possibility of tentatively opening to a few children at a time. It is important that we know how many pupils we are predicting to arrive (if and when we start to process) to see if we have sufficient space and staffing to make it work.

Please note that the Government has been very clear that attendance at school during this period is not compulsory for any child; we are not reporting attendance.

Things we have taken into consideration are as follows:

- Children who return to school will work in groups of no more than 10 children from their class. These groups will not change and the groups will not mix at any point during the school day. The children will be taught by the same adults each and every day. Adults will not move between groups. If a member of staff is off school poorly, the whole group/ "bubble" of pupils will not be able to attend.
- We will do our very best to encourage social distancing but feel you need to know we are not in a position to guarantee this.
- We will operate staggered drop off and pick up times for each group of children to the external classroom doors ONLY. Only one parent or carer will be able to come for drop off/ pick up and must remain 2m from other adults at all times. We will encourage you to use telephone calls to pass information on to teachers/ staff.
- We will not be in a position to open our normal breakfast club but will have breakfast available for those who NORMALLY use this- a "Grab and Go" service in each classroom.
- Our school kitchen will be able to reopen in time for 1st June and meals will be provided for all
 children in Reception and Year 1 and those eligible for FSM in Year 6, unless advised otherwise by you
 as parents in the above survey. Where children are not attending school and are entitled to Free
 School Meals a supermarket voucher will continue to be provided, until we are instructed not to any
 longer, restarting on 1st June.
- The safety of the children and staff is paramount at these times and any children displaying symptoms consistent with Co-Vid 19 will be sent home, guidance will be provided for prompt testing and a period of isolation following a positive test will follow.
- During our period of opening, arrangements could change. We may be in a position to have more children in school or we may have to close school to certain groups of children depending on Government guidance and staffing levels. Parents will be expected to respond to changes the school are required to make, even at short notice.











- Pupils in Y6 will return first and then the other year groups will be phased in thereafter: Y1, then Rec and finally Nursery (timeframes to be confirmed). If a child cannot self-manage toileting or requires positive handling, we will be contacting parents directly about arrangements for them, whether they are able to attend or not, depending on their needs.
- Pupils in Y2, 3, 4 and 5 will remain at home in the first instance and teachers will continue to provide work for them remotely.

Please bear with us while we continue our work to make preparations and keep your eye out on Facebook and our new website for decisions and final plans and when/ if they take effect. We are still waiting for further guidance and reassurance from the Government, the Department for Education and also the Trust to enable us to open with confidence, as there are many questions still unanswered. We will not open unless we know it is safe to do so for the safety of our pupils, their families and our staff. If we are not confident in the number of staff available to come in to work, we may need to delay any decisions by a week from 1st June, until we have this securely in place.

Our Trust (CIT) will also be issuing a letter from the Governing Trustees Board for you next week.

Thank you for staying united and for working with the school, for your messages of support and for the work and support you are providing for your children at home.
