Next steps for our pupils.... a possible return for some?

Last night, no doubt, you will have heard the Prime Minister indicating that the government believes it may be considering a phased re-opening of schools from 1 June, starting with pupils in Reception, Year One and Year Six. This is part of the government's conditional plan, which it says will remain under regular review. All of us at St Paul's want to get more pupils back into school as soon as it is safe to do so- we do not want to see classrooms empty for a day longer than they need to be. However, as any school leader will tell you, the first priority has to be the safety of everyone in the school community.

Like you, we have only just seen the announcement and at this stage we are unable to answer your potential questions. We are waiting to receive more information from government and our Trust (C.I.T) about what this means for our school. In the short-term, however, nothing has changed and we will continue our childcare provision to support to those families who are most vulnerable or who are key workers. Further information will be shared with you in the coming days and weeks, once we are able to do so.

Ultimately, we know our school best. If the national guidance (once known) cannot be safely applied in our school, we will retain the power along with our local governing body and trust board to make decisions regarding the safety of pupils and staff based on our own individual risk assessments. This may ultimately mean that our school may not in a position to expand pupil numbers in the way the government has indicated on the 1 June.

As usual, we will keep in touch with you every steps of the way and ensure you have the information you need! In the meantime, please continue to stay safe!

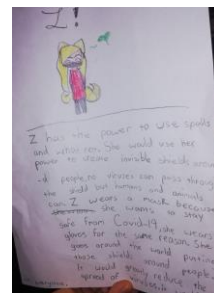
