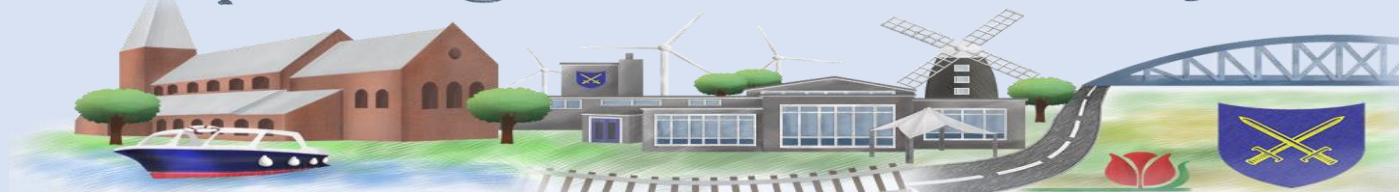

It is really important that parents attend these meetings as it is a good opportunity to catch up with your child's class teacher and discuss the progress your child is making.

Class Dojo

Many parents have now signed up to class dojo which sends you instant messages when your child has achieved a Dojo point for positive behaviour. The children are working hard to save up their Dojo points to spend in the school shop.

We are now also going to be using class Dojo for class teachers to communicate everyday messages with parents and also to upload any work your child needs to do and photos of them doing some amazing things in class.

We will still be using ParentMail for whole school key information. It is very important that you are connected to ParentMail otherwise you may miss important information regarding your child. If you are experiencing difficulties connecting to ParentMail, please contact the school office.

However, Dojo will not be used as a way of you communicating with staff. If you wish to speak to your child's class teacher they are always available at the end of the school day or you can send an email via enquiries using the address at the top of this letter (adding for the attention of..) and the office staff will ensure messages are passed to the correct member of staff. Staff will respond to email within 5 working days.

Class Dojo is completely free to use so if you haven't already downloaded the app now is a good time so you don't miss out on any key information. If you need any support with this please speak to your child's class teacher.

Updated details.

If your details change please can you inform the school office. We will be sending home a student update form for each child and it is really important that you check all the information on the form, amend any details which are incorrect and send it back to school.

Ideally we would like 3 or more emergency contact numbers for each pupil so that in the case of an emergency we are able to contact a familiar adult, especially where we are unable to contact the child's parents.
