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Online Learning/Website:

Parents, how many of you look at our school website? How do you find the school Padlet system (Year 5 are currently Using this)?

Behind our school website there is the capability to have a Virtual Learning Environment or VLE which allows you to access your children's work that the teacher puts on and also submit it. We can also send direct messages to you or whole school letters. You can even keep track of your own child's attendance. All this can be done from an app on your smart phone or via a tablet or PC.

I expect most parents now have access to a smart phone and if you download the app you can get all information the school sends out with the added bonus of notifications in case of those unforeseen emergencies.

Attendance record:

On the news this week you might have seen that attendances in schools across the country is falling and on average is now well below 90% which is considered persistent absence. Well this isn't the case at St Paul's. We have an attendance of approximately 95% which considering the circumstances that we are in is very good.

We really want to keep this up because as you know if a child is not in school their learning will be affected negatively. Although we need to be mindful of the Covid symptoms and remember that the children will need a Covid Test if they are displaying the symptoms we all know. A new persistent cough, a high temperature, a loss of smell and taste.

Please also be mindful of the time your child's class is due into school. Lateness disrupts the whole class as well as having a negative effect on your child. Please try to get to school on time!
