Dear Parents and Carers

We are so proud of how well your children have returned to school. They have settled so well, after months of lockdown and the summer break. Thank you for the support you gave to your child's home learning during the period of lockdown.



Now that we are back at school and learning in our new year groups, we are working hard with your children, to help them be successful in their learning. Our **phonics learning is crucial** to your child's success in reading and writing. This is where we need your help. Despite you, your child, and their teachers working so hard during lockdown, our children have missed a lot of learning and there are gaps which we need to try to fill so they can catch up and keep up.

This academic year, children in Year One & Year Two classes will take the government's Phonics Screening, an assessment of children's ability to read words accurately. Year Two children will take the assessment in **December 2020**, and Year One in June 2021. Success in this assessment will set your child in really good stead for their learning as they move through the school. To help prepare your child for this assessment, school staff are providing at least 2 phonics learning sessions every day, and extra small group sessions. We would like to ask you to help with this, by supporting your child to complete tasks at home, which will be set by their class teacher.

Some parents find they become worried when trying to help children with phonics at home. One of the most important things to remember is that when making the sounds, they need to be "pure" sounds, not letter names. We would read this word: "mmm,a,d, mad," rather than "muh, ah, duh."
