Some pupils have found the work a little challenging (after such a long time away from school) and their teachers are working hard to find out what they can remember and then accelerate their learning through to where they need to be. - Hearing your child **READ EVERYDAY** and talk about what they have read
- Practice their **number** recognition and counting on and back/ their number bonds/ timetables......
- Practice their **writing** for different purposes- making lists, writing short stories, writing descriptions of objects, keeping a diary of what they are doing at home.....
- Using the internet and books about their **topic theme** and encourage them to ask questions and work together to find the answers
- Complete their **homework** each week and make sure it is handed in on time

You can play a BIG part in helping your child to catch up on lost ground and the teachers are always happy to give advice and help wherever they can. NO QUESTION is a SILLY QUESTION!
